High Point Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes 2/9/2023 Via Zoom

President Kelly called the meeting to order at 6:30pm welcoming 19 members and special guest speaker, Linda Pearl.

Amendment Twelve: Kelly called for a vote by the membership for Amendment Twelve to the By-Laws, which will replace the entire paragraph under the HPQG By Laws Article XI - Contracts, Checks and Drafts.

Amendment Twelve: "The President, with consent of the Guild membership, will be authorized to enter contracts on behalf of the Guild. This consent will be determined by majority vote of the quorum present when said contracts are proposed. The President is authorized to given written permission to any other elected officer to sign any approved contract instead of the President. The board will approve a yearly budget to cover the cost of Guild-related functions. Although any elected officer is authorized to write checks and drafts on behalf of the Guild, it is preferred that this be done by either the Treasurer or President. Any check up to the amount of \$500.00 may be signed solely by any elected officer of the board, but preferably the Treasurer. Any check over \$500.00 must bear the signature of two elected officers of the board, with one of those elected officers preferably being the Treasurer."

A vote was taken and the Amendment was passed unanimously.

Program - Susan introduced Linda Pearl and her program "Ten Quilters You Should Know and Why -Part 2". Linda presented Part 1 to the Guild in February 2022. Her presentation began by referencing North Carolina's Public Television in 1978 with Georgia Bonesteel and Lap Quilting. The Global Quilt Connection was designed to assist guilds, teachers and program presenters to bridge the gap between in-person and virtual meetings during the Pandemic. Information on copyright protection and the Modern Quilting Movement was also presented. Thanks to Linda for an excellent program.

January 2023 Meeting Minutes - Diantha - A motion was made by Angie and seconded by Wendy to approve the January 12, 2023 meeting minutes. All in favor.

Treasurer's Report, January 2023 - Alicia - The Treasurer's Report was emailed to the membership February 6, 2023. Beginning balance \$14,378.79, two outstanding checks: Spring Retreat \$450.00 and Program \$400.00, ending balance \$13,528.79. A motion was made by Sherri and seconded by Nancy to approve the January 2023 Treasurer's Report. All in favor.

Fall Retreat - October 19-22, 2023 - Haw River - Sherri informed everyone there were limited spaces available; if interested please contact her asap.

2023 Raffle Quilt Update - Sherri informed everyone there has been a delay in the quilting due to mechanical issues with Gina Boone's machine.

Sherri also discussed the importance and need of a Marketing Committee. Responsibilities include the printing, packaging and distribution of tickets, securing different venues to sell tickets, setting up and taking down at venues, etc. Discussion ensued about the possibility of members selling tickets to friends and family without taking it to venues, and increasing the price of tickets. Janet has offered to order the tickets when a decision is made on the price and how many are needed. The raffle quilt is on a 2-year cycle and is the only fund raiser the Guild has at this time. Funds raised help support our programs. Please let Kelly or Sherri know if you are interested.
