High Point Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes May 11, 2023

President Kelly called the meeting to order at 6:35pm welcoming members and guests. May birthday wishes were given.

Meeting Minutes April 13, 2023 - Diantha - CORRECTION

****HPQG Website - Alicia informed everyone that she had been notified that we exceeded our storage on the website and there would be AN ADDITIONAL \$60.00 yearly fee unless we reduced our storage. With the Board of Director's approval, she has deleted everything before 2019.

A motion by Wendy, seconded by Nancy to approve the April 13, 2023 minutes with the above correction was made. All in favor.

Treasurer - Alicia requested permission to transfer \$50.00 overage from the Spring Retreat account to the Sit-and-Sew Donation account. Sherri made a motion to approve the transfer of the \$50.00 (Spring Retreat) from the Restricted Income Account to the General Expenses Account (Sit and Sew Donations), seconded by Gail. All in favor.

Treasurer - Alicia requested permission to pay the remaining facility rent for 2023 (\$175.00 for June through December) and the remaining Saturday Sit-and-Sew rent for 2023 (\$200.00 - May, June, August and September). A motion was made by Kelly and seconded by Elizabeth to pay the remaining seven months Facility and four months Sit-and-Sew rent for 2023. All in favor.

2024 Fall Retreat - Sherri - The park has increased their fees slightly for 2024. Campers wanting a single room will see the largest price increase. Reservations have been made. The retreat will be October 24 - 27, 2024. Sherri has copies of the updated prices and registration form. She will also post them on our website at highpointquiltguild.com.

Raffle Quilt - Sherri - The quilt should be ready soon. Please remember that the Raffle Quilt is our only fund raiser. A Marketing Committee is still needed. If interested, please contact Sherri.

At the April Board meeting, we wrote up some guidelines that reflect the desires of those who have been attending and are compatible with the requirements of the Northwood Community Center. Dates and times for 2023 Saturday Sit-and-Sews: June 10, August 12, September 16 Northwood Community Center, 9:00am to 5:00pm

Sign up: Sign-up sheet is on the membership table at the Thursday guild meeting before each Saturday. You can sign up for multiple dates.

If you cannot make the meeting and want to sign up, you may email/text/call Karen Tooley by noon before the meeting.

Members are still welcome to drop in on Saturday without signing up, however there is no guarantee of tables or space.

Cost: \$5.00 minimum, non-refundable donation per person to be paid when you sign up. Additional donations will be greatly appreciated.

Adult Guests welcome! They may sign up at end of the meeting after members, who will have first chance. (\$5.00 minimum, non-refundable donation) Kids are welcome, if coming with a member and if they have an interest in sewing/fiber arts. They will be considered on an individual basis. They must participate as an adult would with relevant projects for the day and must be supervised by the guild member. (\$5.00 minimum, non-refundable donation)

Lunch is up to the individual. Bring your own, order in, or go out to local establishments. Snacks to share are optional.

Maximum number: We may have a 14-person limit because of limited electricity/space. The number is flexible depending on hand-sewers.

Product: Steamfast SF-717 Mini Steam Iron with Dual Voltage, Travel Bag, Non-Stick Soleplate, Anti-Slip Handle, Rapid Heating, 420W Power, White

High Point Quilt Guild 2024 Drop Everything and Just Quilt Retreat

Please read the following registration form carefully. The retreat is scheduled for October 24 – 27, 2024. Please check your calendar before committing to the retreat.

The park has increased their fees slightly for 2024. Those campers wanting a single room will see the largest price increase. Still, all of the fees are much lower than we would pay if we held the retreat at a hotel or other location. Please keep in mind Haw River State Park has only increased its prices three times since 2012 – the first year we held our retreat.

The prices are as follows:

Single room, three nights -- \$448.00

Single room, two nights -- \$302.00

Single room, one night -- \$156.00

Double room, three nights -- \$299.50

Double room, two nights -- \$203.00

Double room, one night -- \$106.50

Day Campers -- \$25.00 per day. Fee includes lunch only Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

For those overnight campers who are arriving early on Thursday, please note your lunch for Thursday is no longer included in the cost. If you plan to eat lunch in the park on Thursday, please add \$20.00 to your cost. We must have 10 campers who want lunch on Thursday before the park will prepare it. Dinner is included on Thursday.

Single rooms occupancy is limited and available on a first come, first served basis. Deposits can be made at guild meetings or mailed to High Point Quilt Guild, PO Box 2036, Jamestown, NC, in care of the Guild Treasurer. Checks or money orders should be made out to High Point Quilt Guild.

A \$70.00 deposit is required for all overnight campers. This fee is nonrefundable and is due by January 1, 2024. The balance is due by September 15 and is also *non-refundable*. Day campers should also have their fees paid by September 15 and these fees are also *non-fundable*.
