
Remember that there will be no charity quilt table at our meeting this month for lack of space – please save your quilts for the April meeting when we will be in person again. In addition, there will also be no free table.

High Point Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes November 9, 2023

President Kelly called the meeting to order at 6:30pm welcoming members and four visitors.

Membership - Karen introduced our visitors and November birthday wishes were given.

Program - Lisa Alley - "Calm the Chaos" in your sewing space. Lisa started quilting in 1991, and it did not take long before her sewing room became filled with fabric, batting, notions and everything pertaining to quilting. A good friend asked Lisa if she would like help to "calm the chaos" and Lisa agreed. She walked us through their process, and showed photos, which included yard sales and donations. She stated that it was very time-consuming and is a constant process to keep her space calm. Thank you to Lisa for all the great information and ideas to help our members calm our chaos in our sewing rooms.

Minutes October 12, 2024 - Kelly for Diantha - One correction to the minutes. Alicia (Treasurer) stated she has not paid Northwood Community Center for our 2024 regular meetings and the Saturday Sit and Sew yet. The payments for both will be made at the end of December 2023. A motion by Janet, seconded by Wendy to approve the minutes for the October 12, 2024 was made with the above correction. All in favor.

Treasurer's Report, October 2024 - Alicia - The October 2023 Treasurer's Report was emailed to the membership on 11/5/2023. Beginning balance \$11,597.78, income \$1,019.00, no expenses, ending balance \$12,616.78. A motion by Sherri, seconded by Juanita to approve the October 2023 Treasurer's Report was made. All in favor.

Membership - Karen - The 2024 membership dues are due in January. Our January, February and March meetings are via Zoom, not in person. Karen has asked that everyone complete the entire membership form. Please remember to complete Part B and sign. Dues for 2024 are \$35.00 (non refundable). 2024 Drop Everything and Just Quilt Retreat

Please read the following registration form carefully. The retreat is scheduled for October 24 – 27, 2024. Please check your calendar before committing to the retreat.

The park has increased their fees slightly for 2024. Those campers wanting a single room will see the largest price increase. Still, all of the fees are much lower than we would pay if we held the retreat at a hotel or other location. Please keep in mind Haw River State Park has only increased its prices three times since 2012 – the first year we held our retreat.

The prices are as follows:

- Single room, three nights -- \$448.00
- Single room, two nights -- \$302.00
- Single room, one night -- \$156.00
- Double room, three nights -- \$299.50
- Double room, two nights -- \$203.00
- Double room, one night -- \$106.50

Day Campers -- \$25.00 per day. Fee includes lunch only Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

For those overnight campers who are arriving early on Thursday, please note your lunch for Thursday is no longer included in the cost. If you plan to eat lunch in the park on Thursday, please add \$20.00 to your cost. We must have 10 campers who want lunch on Thursday before the park will prepare it. Dinner is included on Thursday.

Single room occupancy is limited and available on a first come, first served basis. Deposits can be made at guild meetings or mailed to High Point Quilt Guild, PO Box 2036, Jamestown, NC, in care of the Guild Treasurer. Checks or money orders should be made out to High Point Quilt Guild.

A \$70.00 deposit is required for all overnight campers. This fee is nonrefundable and is due by January 1, 2024. The balance is due by September 15, 2024 and is also <u>non-</u> <u>refundable</u>. Day campers should also have their fees paid by September 15, 2024 and these fees are also <u>non-fundable</u>.
