Officers, Chairs and Committee Reports:

High Point Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes January 9, 2025 (Zoom Meeting)

President Juanita welcomed 19 members and one guest speaker at 6:30pm. Birthday wishes were given.

Juanita asked if there were corrections to last month's minutes and there were not. A motion was made by Nancy and seconded by Janet to approve the minutes. All in favor.

Sherri presented the Treasurer's Report on behalf of Alicia. November's end balance was \$16,979.95. Deposits of 883.00, checks cleared 216.00, credit card payments 279.75, an outstanding deposit of \$800.00. The balance is currently \$16,884.20. A motion was made by Angie and seconded by Kelly to approve the Treasurer's report. All in favor.

Sherri stated that the Guild Budget for 2025 was very similar to the budget for 2024 and asked for questions or comments regarding this year's budget. There were no questions or comments. A motion was made by Janet and seconded by MaryBeth to approve the budget for 2025. All in favor.

Sherri introduced Robin Thomas and her program: the 100 Day Quilt Project. Ms. Thomas owns and operates RCT Quilts and told the group about her background. She was inspired when she learned of Yale University professor Michael Bierut, who challenged his college students to a 100 Day Project. This was defined as a creative activity or operation repeated for 100 consecutive days, and documented each day for the completion of a cohesive project. Ms. Thomas told us about her project using binding, and showed beautiful quilts. She stated that the keys to the success of the project are to keep the daily activities small, fast (10-15 minutes each day) and cohesive. She stated that it is a good idea to set boundaries or "rules" for yourself, with some flexibility built in. Members can go to 100dayproject.org for ideas and interesting posts. Thank you to Robin for an interesting and inspiring program.

Programs – Sherri – Program for February: Infinite Opportunity - Quilts Hidden in Your Stash

As quilters, we love to collect beautiful fabrics – yet we are often unsure how to put them all together to make quilts that we love. The term "scrap quilt" may bring to mind using leftovers that don't necessarily look good together. By contrast, while STASH

quilts utilize your stash and scraps, they contain thoughtfully selected materials and look BETTER because of the variety – not tired because they were created just to use up fabrics. The lecture addresses several key design principles that make multi-fabric quilts work and includes pairs of quilts to show the impact of incorporating these considerations. Multiple examples of color combinations are provided to give ideas for selecting and using fabrics from your stash to make fabulous multi-fabric quilts.

Fall Retreat, Sherri –

The 2025 Fall Quilt Retreat is October 16-19, 2025 at Haw River State Park. Two- and three-night stays are available, as well as the option of being a day camper.
